#### **Science Olympiad News**

The Senior High Science Olympiad tournament was held on February 2nd, 2019 at SUNY Brockport. #### **Pirate Challenge**

This update includes the first release of the contest announcement for the Pirate Challenge. There is a distinct possibility that an event or two may be added. Sunday's event list is a bit light. Each year the FAC always runs some "special" events at the Nationals or Non-Nationals. Those events have not yet been announced so we are keeping our options open for including one or more of those "specials".

If it is decided not to include any of those choices, we will likely include a Low Wing Military Trainer event. If you have a Modern LWMT, it can be flown in the Modern Military event IF and ONLY IF LWMT is not added to the event list. Note that in any case, both Modern Military and LWMT (should it be included) will be flown as mass launch events.

Sharp eyed readers will note that we have included THREE events for juniors. Details will be worked out later with an eye to maximum fun. We may do Sky Bunny mass launch or Sky Bunny ROT. Maybe both. We intend to provide merchandise prizes for all junior competitors. If you are bringing youthful participants, let us know so sufficient prize stuff is available. If you would like to clean out your stack formerly precious kits, this could be just the opportunity. Send the editor an email with a list of what you are interested in contributing. Rest assured, based on our previous experience, your contributions WILL be appreciated.

Finally, since this is a mostly FAC event, we do follow the Builder of the Model rule. That being (truly) said, we do wish to encourage participation of the youngest possible competitors. Your editor hopes to encourage two of his three year old grandkids. They really have too little attention span (not sure where they inherited that!) and very limited fine motor skills. They will be doing well to help decorate and launch their own ships. In other words, BOM should keep in mind the capabilities of the competitor. Nobody should be excluded just because they did not harvest their own balsa tree.
